
Newsletter of the Albert Park Bowls Club Inc

### Twilight League is back for 2022/23

This popular competition will run over 20 rounds during daylight savings from 26 October 2022 to 22 March 2023. Matches will comprise 12-end three-bowl pairs matches (with a two-bowl triples match if numbers require it).

Entry fee is \$10, This will entitle a player to participate in as many of the 20 rounds as they wish. Entry fees will be pooled to provide the end of season prize money, as well as a quarterly prize for the ladder leader. The competition is open to all

(Social as well as Bowls) members of APBC. To join, just turn up by 5:45pm on the first Wednesday you are available, no prior sign-up is required.

Partnerships and opponents are drawn largely at random but with a couple of constraints; Some grading of players will take place to avoid grossly uneven contests with some reshuffling to avoid repeat pairings.

The prize pool will be distributed to players who finish with a positive points tally in proportion to

their accumulated points. The current points tally for each participant will be published regularly in Parkers and posted on the club noticeboard. The full Conditions of Play, including how points are calculated, will be posted shortly on the Club Noticeboard.

Matches will start at 6pm and should run for about 90 minutes. Please arrive by 5:45pm to enable the teams to be arranged and scorecards prepared. Latecomers may be disappointed.

### APBC BUILDING FUND

As we've announced previously, Port Phillip City Council has committed to funding a major upgrade of the clubhouse female facilities next winter (June-September). The timing is opportune as we will be celebrating the 150th annual Opening of the Green in December 2023 as part of our Sesquicentenary celebrations

throughout the 2023-24 season. To complement this work, the club is planning to fund a similar upgrade to the male facilities. While we have some funds already available for this work, they will not be enough. So we are launching a dedicated Builidng Fund to accumulate the neccesary amount in time to have the two projects rolled out together.

Our aim is to raise \$250k and we have already received a number of sizeable contributions. Donations of \$200 or more will be recognised by inclusion on a commemorative honour board to be mounted on one of the refurbished clubhouse walls. Additional means of recognition will include:

### **Pennant performance Evaluation**

- Skippers will assess all players on their rink out of 10. (5 being average standard game at that level)
- This information is open to all players of that rink and the selectors/coach will use the information to guide selection an coaching.

### **Technique tips**

- Improve delivery
- Have a good Aiming Line method
- Work on your Weight Control

### **Bowls Self Evaluation**

Give yourself a score out of 10 for the following skills.

- **Draw Shot**
- Competitive ability
- Drive or fast shots
- **Technique**
- Concentration
- Confidence
- Bowl type (new that turn a bit)
- Ability on fast and slow greens
- disciplined play
- Team support
- Tactics and strategy

### **Skipper Communication**

- Give clear instructions for the player to understand the shot required.
- Show positive support for your team.
- Call low % shots only when safe to do so.
- Draw for 2nd or 3rd shot when trying to cut down bad head.
