APBC HISTORICAL PERSONALITIES

MARGARET Gardiner CUTHBERTSON

Born in Bacchus Marsh in 1864, Margaret was instrumental in starting up the South Melbourne

Bowling Club for women. In 1899, the family was living at 35 St Vincent Place, opposite the South Melbourne Bowling Club, which at this stage was for men only.

Ladies bowling was till only relatively new. The first ladies' bowls club in the world had been formed the previous year at Rainsford Bowls Club in Glenferrie, Melbourne.

The president of the South Melbourne Bowling Club, Cr James Cockbill, was a friend of Margaret's brother, Robert Melville Cuthbertson.

Margaret and her sister, Ada, asked if they could join in a social day.

It wasn't much later that the ladies section of the club was formed (the South Melbourne Ladies' Bowling Club, or 'SMLBC').

Margaret was the first Secretary and held that position for seventeen years, from 1900–1917. She was also one of the foundation members of the VLBA, the oldest women's bowling association in the world. It was formed in October 1907, 22 years earlier than the next oldest, the NSW Bowls Association.

Margaret was a consumate bowler: Ladies' Champion of the club 5 times (1907, 1908, 1909, 1916 and 1919) and Ladies Bowling Champion of Victoria in 1906, played on the South Melbourne green that year. She also won the club Ladies' Pairs championship that year, partnering with Mrs Paterson. In 1919, she won the VLBA Champion of Champions competition for the third time.

Margaret died after a long illness on 17 November 1944.
